## Help for Houses of Worship

## Was your nonprofit facility damaged by the December 2023 storms and tornadoes?

Private nonprofits, including houses of worship and other faith-based organizations, in Cheatham, Davidson, Dickson, Gibson, Montgomery, Robertson, Stewart, Sumner and Weakley counties may be eligible for FEMA Public Assistance to help cover the cost of emergency protective measures, debris removal and repair or replacement of facilities damaged during the storms.



The program is funded by FEMA and administered through Tennessee Emergency Management Agency (TEMA).

## Eligibility

To be eligible, your facility must have damage caused by the Dec. 9, 2023 disaster and you must provide a current ruling letter from the IRS granting tax exemption under Section 501 (c) (d) or (e) of the IRS Code or provide documentation from the state confirming it is a nonprofit. TEMA and FEMA will work with you to determine eligibility.

## How to apply

Submit a Request for Public Assistance in the FEMA Grants Portal. This is the only method by which an applicant may be eligible to participate in the Public Assistance Program. Go to: <a href="https://grantee.fema.gov/">https://grantee.fema.gov/</a>. You will need to create an account.
